

# **SERMON OUTLINE**

**SERMON TITLE:** You're Never a Failure Till You Quit

**SERMON REFERENCE:** Galatians 5:22, James 1:3-12

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We are grateful for the opportunity to provide this outline produced from a sermon preached by Adrian Rogers while serving as pastor of Bellevue Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee.

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#### 1) INTRODUCTION

- a) Galatians 5:22
  - i) The word "longsuffering" means "patient."
  - ii) The fruit of the Spirit is patience.
- b) Are you an impatient person?
  - i) How do you handle interruptions?
  - ii) How do you deal with irritations?
    - (1) Long lines?
    - (2) Traffic jams?
    - (3) Flat tires?
  - iii) How do you deal with inconveniences?
    - (1) We now have fast foods, the fast lane at the checkout counter, instant coffee, and microwaves.
    - (2) Everything is fast because we want it, and we want it now.
- c) We are an impatient people.
- d) In addition to inconveniences, how do you deal with incapacities?
  - i) How do you react when there's a situation with your health or in your family that you want to change but you don't have the capacity to change?
- e) How do you deal with imponderables?
  - i) Not only is there nothing you can do about the situation, but you can't even understand it.
    - (1) It doesn't even make sense.
  - ii) We have need of patience.
- f) Why do we have these irritations, incapacities, imponderables, and inconveniences?
  - i) Romans 5:3
  - ii) These things come into our lives not only to reveal our impatience, but God is also allowing them to grow patience in our lives.
  - iii) The fruit of the Spirit is patience.
    - (1) These irritations in our lives are not obstacles; they are opportunities to grow patience.
- g) In today's message, we will look at what patience is, what it does, and how to have it.

# 2) WHAT IS PATIENCE? (GALATIANS 5:22)

- a) Galatians 5:22
  - In the King James Version of Scripture, "patience" is called "longsuffering."
- b) Patience is not merely the ability to put up with a tedious task.
  - i) Nor is it just the ability to endure pain, suffering, or irritable people.
    - (1) This is patience, but patience is also more than this.
- c) It has been said that patience is the spirit which can bear things, not simply with resignation but with blazing hope.

- i) It is not patience which grimly waits for the end, but patience radiantly hopes for the dawn.
- ii) This is what the word "long-suffering" means.
  - (1) It is not simply sticking it out, not just grinning and bearing it; but it is saying that whatever befalls us, Jesus does all things well.
    - (a) And in the midst of this, we will give Him praise.
    - (b) This is patience, endurance, and long-suffering.
- d) If we do not learn patience, then we'll not learn anything else.
  - i) It takes discipline at the piano to be able to play well.
    - (1) If we don't have patience, then we'll not know music.
  - ii) If you're a student and don't have patience, then you'll not learn the topic you're studying.
  - iii) If we do not have patience in life, then we are a failure.
    - (1) It is not that we will be a failure, but we are already a failure.
    - (2) A person is not a failure until he quits.
      - (a) If we quit, we are always a failure.

### 3) WHAT PATIENCE DOES (JAMES 1:3-12)

- a) Patience is important.
  - i) It allows us to be full-grown Christians.
    - (1) People can look at us and see Jesus Christ.
  - ii) It allows us to be victorious in every circumstance.
    - (1) We can triumph over everything that comes to us.
  - iii) It brings sufficiency to our lives; every need is met.
  - iv) It brings us perfect peace and tranquility.
    - (1) All of these things come through patience.
- b) James 1:3-4
  - i) The testing of our faith comes through irritations, imponderables, inconveniences, trials, and tears.
  - ii) In this passage, the word "perfect" means "mature."
- c) God wants us to be full-grown, mature Christians.
  - i) There is no maturity without patience and no patience without trials.
  - ii) If we are not mature, then we are not like the Lord Jesus Christ.
  - iii) God wants to bring us to the fullness of Christ.
    - (1) Ephesians 3:19
    - (2) The way that God does this is to allow us to have trials and tribulations in order that we might be mature.
  - iv) Children are not patient.
    - (1) They do not know the difference between "no" and "not yet."
    - (2) God wants to grow us up and make us mature.
      - (a) The only way we will learn maturity is through tribulation that leads to patience.
  - v) We do not want to have any problems.
    - (1) We want to go through life in perfect ease.

- (a) If we do, then we will never be mature Christians.
- vi) Tribulation brings patience, and patience makes us mature.
  - (1) If we are having difficulty, then we should ask for wisdom.
    - (a) James 1:5
  - (2) Many times when tribulation comes, we ask the Lord to take it away.
    - (a) That ought not to be our prayer to begin with.
      - (i) Not, "Lord, take it away," but "Lord, give me wisdom."
        - 1. What are we supposed to learn in this situation?
  - (3) Don't waste your sorrows and troubles.
    - (a) If God is bringing these things into our lives to mature us and it is a test, then we need to pray to God to give us the wisdom to pass the test so He will not keep giving it.
- vii) The fruit of patience is maturity.
- d) We want to be victorious Christians.
  - i) James 1:12
    - (1) In this passage, the word "endure" means "patience."
  - ii) The Apostle Paul said that we are to reign in this life.
    - (1) Romans 5:17
  - iii) We are to be victors in this life.
    - (1) A child is not a victor.
      - (a) A spiritual child is a victim.
    - (2) God wants us to be strong.
      - (a) He does not want us to be putty in the devil's hands.
    - (3) He wants us to be victorious warriors.
      - (a) The only way that we are going to do this is by living victoriously in the Lord Jesus Christ.
        - (i) 2 Corinthians 2:14
  - iv) When trials come and we endure, then we mature.
    - (1) Then, when we mature and the devil comes with these trials, we are victors rather than victims because we are strong.
    - (2) Proverbs 25:28
      - (a) Someone who does not have any rule over their own spirit has never learned maturity.
        - (i) They have no patience.
        - (ii) They are like a city that is broken down and has no walls.
          - 1. The enemy can come and go at will.
          - 2. Their life, home, business, and witness are in shambles because they have no rule over their own spirit.
            - a. They have never learned patience.
    - (3) We are supposed to endure until we mature.
    - (4) When the enemy comes, no matter what happens, begin to praise God.
      - (a) If the trial is from God, then why shouldn't we praise Him?
      - (b) If it is from the devil, then praise God anyway.
        - (i) The last thing the devil wants us to do is to praise God.

- (c) 1 Thessalonians 5:18
- e) Patience is necessary to prosperity.
  - i) James 5:7-8
    - (1) In this verse, the word "husbandman" means "farmer."
    - (2) We cannot hurry the harvest.
  - ii) If we want prosperity, then we are going to have to have patience.
    - (1) Galatians 6:9
  - iii) The law of the harvest is that we reap what we sow, more than we sow, and later than we sow.
    - (1) The reason many of us do not reap is that we do not wait.
      - (a) Patience is necessary.
    - (2) First, the farmer has the former rain (the rain in the Spring).
      - (a) He puts the seed in the ground, and God rains upon it.
        - (i) This causes the grain of wheat to begin to grow.
    - (3) Then, the farmer has to wait.
    - (4) Finally, there comes the latter rain in the Fall.
      - (a) This causes the shoot to grow and the grain to form and ripen.
        - (i) Then, it is ready for the harvest.
    - (5) The farmer waits patiently on the former and latter rains.
  - iv) The Bible says that we are to wait on the Lord.
    - (1) Psalm 27:14
    - (2) Isaiah 30:18
    - (3) Delays are not denials.
    - (4) If we want God to answer our prayers, then we are going to have to learn to wait on the Lord.
      - (a) The Lord does not answer right away because He wants us to grow.
        - (i) It is His way of ripening grain and ripening us.
          - 1. The answer is not ripe yet.
    - (5) With God, timing is far more important than time.
      - (a) Galatians 6:9
      - (b) God knows what is good for the child and when it is good for the child.
- f) Patience is necessary for tranquility.
  - i) James 5:10-11
  - ii) There is no happiness and tranquility without patience.
    - (1) An impatient person is always an unhappy person.
    - (2) A person cannot be happy and impatient at the same time.
  - iii) If you are having trouble with patience, then try a little laughter.
    - (1) Learn to laugh at your problems.
      - (a) We will never run out of anything to laugh at.
    - (2) Laughter is not frivolous.
      - (a) God made us to laugh.
  - iv) God wants us to have a certain amount of joy.

- v) There are some things that we will not have tranquility about until we accept them with patience.
  - (1) In life, there are a lot of things we cannot change.
  - (2) Philippians 4:11

## 4) HOW TO HAVE PATIENCE (GALATIANS 5:22)

- a) The fruits of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, and long-suffering.
  - i) Galatians 5:22
  - ii) The sequence of the fruits of the Spirit is no accident.
    - (1) Long-suffering or patience is the composite of love, joy, and peace.
      - (a) 1 Corinthians 13:4
      - (b) Ephesians 4:2
- b) Loveless people are impatient people.
  - i) If a husband is impatient with his wife, then he is not showing her the love that he ought to show her.
  - ii) If parents are impatient with their children, then they are not showing them the love they ought to show to them.
  - iii) The problem is not impatience.
    - (1) The problem is the lack of love.
  - iv) The secret of success for anything is to see things from the other person's point of view.
    - (1) A loveless person is always a selfish person.
      - (a) He is always looking at things from his own viewpoint.
      - (b) He never thinks about the other person's viewpoint.
    - (2) A successful parent can see life from the child's point of view.
    - (3) A successful person in business can see his business from the customer's point of view.
    - (4) A loving person sees the other person's point of view.
    - (5) This is the reason the Bible says that we forebear one another in love and long-suffering.
      - (a) Ephesians 4:2
      - (b) 1 Corinthians 13:4
  - v) If someone is impatient with the faults of other people, then it is because he is an unloving person.
  - vi) We are to be filled with love.
  - vii) Almost nothing will provoke a person filled with love.
    - (1) If a person is not filled with love, then almost anything will provoke him.
- c) Not only does patience come from love, but it also comes from joy.
  - i) Nehemiah 8:10
    - (1) The joy of the Lord is our strength.
      - (a) It takes strength to endure.
  - ii) The next time we feel the need of patience, we need to check our joy quotient.

- (1) Are we rejoicing in the Lord, or has the thing that we have become impatient with made us hateful and spiteful?
  - (a) Impatient people are nasty people.
    - (i) Nasty people are people who are not rejoicing in the Lord.
- iii) We need to learn how to laugh.
  - (1) Laughter is life's shock absorber.
- iv) Psalm 104:26
  - (1) God made whales to play in the sea.
- v) If we are having trouble with impatience, then have a little joy.
  - (1) We need to have a little happiness, fun, and relax a little.
- d) An impatient person is a person with no peace.
  - i) He does not have peace because he has his eyes on whatever is making him impatient rather than having his eyes on the Lord.
    - (1) Isaiah 26:3

#### 5) CONCLUSION

- a) The fruit of the Spirit is long-suffering.
  - i) There is no fruit without life.
  - ii) We cannot manufacture patience.
  - iii) Galatians 5:22
- b) Galatians 5:25
  - i) The only way that fruit will ripen and grow is when it is in the right climate.
  - ii) You are not going to grow and produce the fruit of the Spirit unless you are walking in the Spirit.
- c) You are never a failure until you quit, and you will never have patience until you abide in the Spirit.
- d) We do not produce the fruit; we bear it.
  - i) John 15:7
- e) We cannot bear this fruit without a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.
- f) Do you know Jesus personally? If not, you can pray to Him today by asking Him to come into your life.
- g) Call upon Jesus today. Repent (turn) from your sins, and turn to Jesus. Ask Him to forgive you of your sins, and acknowledge Him as Lord of your life.
  - i) Romans 3:23
  - ii) Romans 10:9-10
  - iii) Romans 10:13
  - iv) Acts 16:31
  - v) John 3:16
